The man who created his own method of personally teaching over two hundred and fifty kids to read, has passed on at the age of eighty-six at his Tuntable home.

His Teaching method for Reading was widely circulated when it was professionally published in two volumes. In its first publication months, over one thousand copies were distributed in NSW schools. For some years I met Jack at least once a week for lunch at Nimbin's Trattoria. Even though he showed signs of slowing down he was still able to impress and inspire, with his modest, positive attitude about life and humanity.

Jack McKinnon was a people person. He left his mark on communities as wide apart as North Queensland and Northern NSW, in practical affairs, as a builder, administrator and community leader.

Jack McKinnon: sadly missed and honoured by family, friends, neighbours and the two hundred and fifty to whom he introduced the magic of reading.

A celebration of Jack's life will take place on Tuntable on Tuesday 10th January. The funeral at 10.30am will be followed by a wake at Tuntable Hall. Please bring food, drink and memories to share.
