NORPA Dance Action, an initiative of Ausdance NSW, presents the 6th annual production of Big Feet Little Feet, a not-to-be-missed gala fund-raising Black Tie old-fashioned glamour event showcasing new contemporary dance, classical and performing art theatre from the Northern Rivers.

Twelve integrated pieces, uniquely choreographed for this smoky cabaret style show, explore the concept of muse: each conceived from the musical inspiration of Neil and Tim Finn songs, reinterpreted by Australian and New Zealand female song artists in the stunning album, "She Will Have Her Way"...consequently the Perpetual Muse.

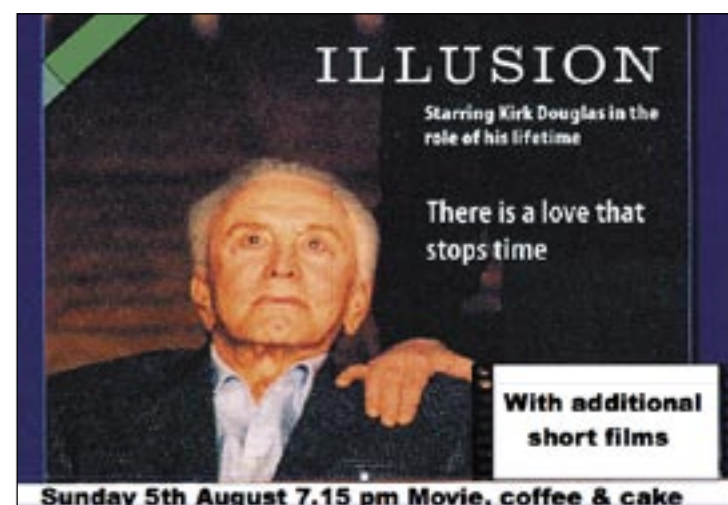
The cycle of muse continues with each choreographer's use of the music to initiate their creative process, sometimes adapting, manipulating or reinterpreting to suit a concept or particular style of dance.

In the case of belly dancing, Amber Wilson, only the merest hint of the track is recognizable in this exotic Hollywood interpretation of the original song. Serena Joy, flamenco dance artist, will perform to live flamenco guitar with the lyrics being sung as a gypsy wail. On Saturday 4th there will be country music with stalls operating in the ground around the Hall. The official opening will take place at 2pm by The Federal Member for Page Mr Ian Causley followed by the presentation of prizes.

On the Sunday there will be entertainment plus viewing of the Art till 3pm.

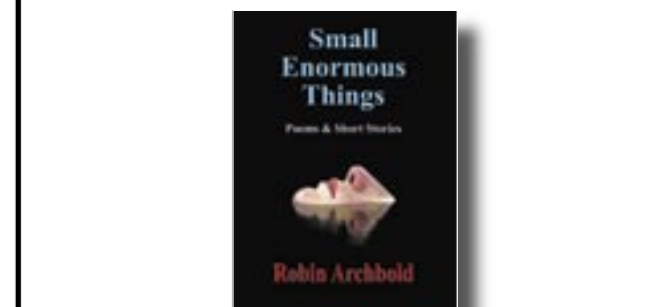
In his foreword to the edition, Graeme Galt says, "You will recognise the lover, the sportsman, the traveller and a man who has learned much along the way."

In the process of crafting these little gems, Archie has thoroughly road-tested the work: with his stories, by publishing them in the GoodTimes; and with his poetry by performing it often at poetry nights, particularly at the Nimbin Oasis cafe.

Of late he has been receiving even more accolades than usual for his work - he won the regional heat for the NSW section of the Australian Poetry Slam at Ballina recently, and at the end of November he gets flown to Sydney to compete in the state finals at the NSW State Library.

As a contestant in the Nimbin Performance Poetry World Cup, he may well deliver renditions of the works in the collection.
