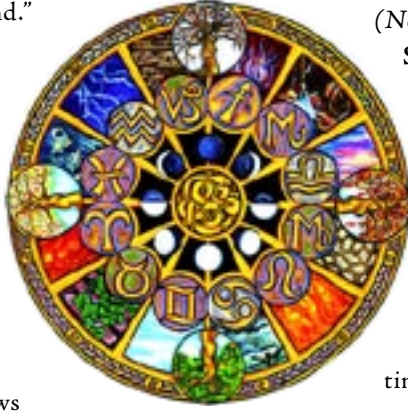

headaches

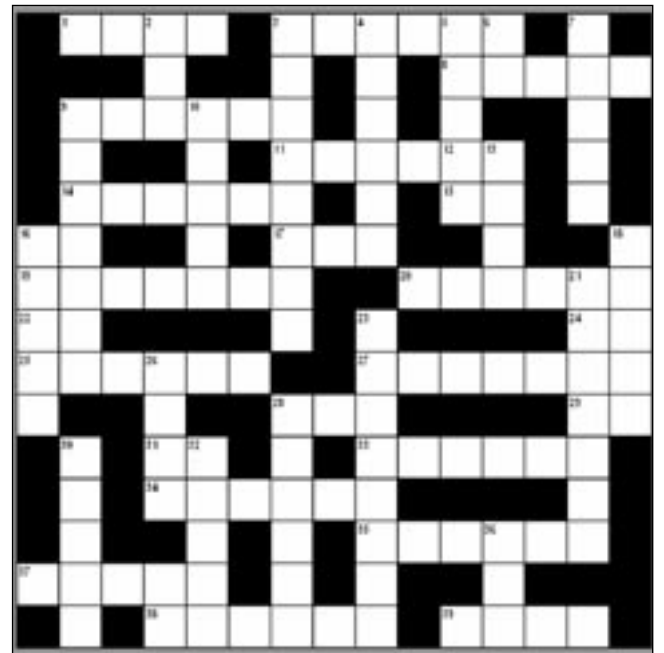
Now that I've mastered the salsa

Interview with East Timor's Ambassador

Last November 28, the Embassy of Timor Leste held an official function to celebrate East Timorese independence at the Albert Hall in Canberra. The Ambassador used the occasion to express his thanks and gratitude to the long time supporters of an independent East Timor. Among the dignitaries and diplomats representing the Embassies of many countries was a representative of Nimbin's community radio 2NimFM, there at the invitation of the Ambassador Hernani Da Silva, who afterwards granted an exclusive interview to community radio 2NimFM.

Hernani began by explaining that November 28 is the date for the declaration of independence of Timor Leste in 1975 by the Fretilin party 32 years ago, just prior to the Indonesian invasion. He pointed out that it is not to be confused with another important date in Timorese history, May 20; (called Restoration Day), marking the success of the popular referendum in 1999 to reject Indonesian integration.

After describing the history of the events leading up to the Indonesian invasion on December 7, 1975, he was persuaded to talk a little about his own memories of the Indonesian occupation, and his role in the Fretilin resistance from a very early age.

"That is a reality faced by most Timorese. By the end of 82 - 83, according to Indonesian figures, the Timorese population was reduced by around 200,000 people. It means that every Timorese family had lost at least one member. Regarding myself - my father was the regional secretary of Fretilin ... of course. After the Indonesian invasion my father had the responsibility of going with the FALINTIL (the armed wing of Fretilin), to fight against the Indonesians. Unfortunately our numbers were very small and we could not stand and fight and we had to escape to the Eastern part of East Timor to the Matabean mountain and continued the resistance there with others until 1978 when almost all of us were captured by the Indonesians.

"Of course my father at the time was a nurse, and as well as his role as regional secretary he also established at that time what you call the 'guerilla hospitals' to help the Falintil when they were wounded and also to help the community in general. We faced a lot of big problems as you can imagine, when people have no food, no clothing and that whole area was infested with mosquitos, a lot of people caught malaria and cholera and other things. So my father was working on that. As well as medical care for the Falintil and the people in general he was also conducting training of nurses for the future, so that was a double role - a hospital and a school at the same time.

"So, we were there until '78 until the encirclement by the Indonesian forces and we were finally captured. We were detained in the subdistrict for one month for the 'brainwashing' process. When we were released my father, because he was a nurse joined the Catholic relief service continuing to provide medical assistance to the people.

"Of course, because it was known that my family was from the Fretilin party we were blacklisted, so it was difficult for us to have access to any services. You couldn't even think of joining the Civil Service at that time. They'd say "You are Fretilin, you want independence, you have no right to ask for anything". But this is the reality of what you believe, a choice we had made - we had to go with that.

"But fortunately our national awareness, our awakening came very early back in the early '80s. Many people who had been supportive, or at least accustomed to the idea of integration with Indonesia began to change their minds.

Then we started a new era of our struggle, after the destruction of our last base in Matabene we started to do what we called the 'clandestine movements' - after we were captured we came down to the city and started the clandestine movement.

"I started to work in the clandestine movements in '82 when I was still in Primary School. We started with very basic small things like passing information, providing medicines, or providing food to our friends who were in the guerrilla, because by that time I had several cousins and nephews who were still fighting in the jungle. So basically we were doing very simple things - not a very sophisticated organization but basically very simple things to help our relatives in the jungle. So whenever my cousin needed something we'd send some out, some medicines or some food, or whenever we got some information about Indonesian military movements we would pass it on to them. We have the contact in the country we know where they are. Of course we don't have much freedom of movement, but there were always ways we could get the information to them.

"That was the situation, and I was involved in this clandestine movement until 1993 when I was repatriated by the Indonesians to Portugal. And from Portugal I went to Macau to complete my studies. By that time I represented the regional Fretilin Committee in Macau. By that time I was working with our friends in Asia and the Pacific trying to work with the Human Rights networks in the region. One of our tasks was to bring to the consciousness of people the reality of what was happening inside East Timor. We were not asking for military intervention but we were campaigning for people to be aware of what was happening inside East Timor.

"And we are very thankful that since '74 and '75 in Australia we have always had these people, our friends, that were actually keeping alive the problem of Timor, in the media, and in the community. We have a lot of friends in Australia who have gone through difficult times, who went against mainstream thinking of the time but they were very consistent in what they believed to be the right of the people of East Timor and finally, that gave encouragement to us.

"I remember because when I was in the jungle and whenever we turned on the radio we could hear people speaking about us we were very happy and it gave us new energy to stand up and continue our fight. So I think those attitudes, those activities that happened abroad, actually become a big inspiration for us in the jungle at that time to continue with our fighting."

Free Software - Open Source

The old saying, "You only get what you pay for", implying that if you pay nothing for something then it's worth nothing, has been turned on its head by the fairly recent phenomenon known as Open Source software.

Open Source refers to software which includes operating systems, word processors, graphics applications, internet browsers and so on, which are freely available to everyone. Who creates these programs? People that love computer programming as a hobby or a vocation and who also support the egalitarian notion that knowledge and information should be free, not controlled by zillionaire corporations.

Thousands of hours of programming go into producing this software, then a sort of cyber community develops, adds refinements, fixes bugs and offers support via blogs and online tutorials.

Before you put any programs on your computer you have to have an operating system. For personal use there are three possibilities: Microsoft Windows XP or Vista, Mac O/S-X and Linux. Windows and Mac are expensive, at least \$300, however, Linux is free!

The later versions of Linux are much more user friendly than a few years ago and can be used alone, or as a dual boot system, or even from the DVD drive using a version such as Ubuntu. Copies of the various versions of Linux are available via internet download (you'll need broadband) or more easily from the CD or DVD which comes with the most popular computer magazines.

Many internet service providers and network servers use Linux systems, they are better suited for this purpose than Windows or Mac, and seem to be more stable and far more secure from malicious attacks from hackers and computer viruses.

This means that far more software, both Open Source and commercial, has become available than previously. Most software developers now produce versions of their software to run on any of the three systems. If you have specific favourite applications and are thinking of changing to Linux, check first to see if

that application is actually available for Linux.

After installing your Open Source operating system the next thing you'll need is an internet browser and an email program. There are many of these freely available.

Even if you choose to run a commercial operating system such as Windows, Open Source applications are available for this also. For example, an excellent web browser is Firefox (rather than Internet Explorer).

There is absolutely no reason to use an expensive word processing package when Open Office is available, this suite is completely compatible with other systems and has virtually all the same features. You can save or open files in all the popular formats, so you can write your letter in Open Office and then send as a Word document if your recipient requires this. I believe it is also compatible with other spread sheets such as Excel.

The graphics application named GIMP is pretty much the same as Adobe Photoshop, so if you need to manipulate your photos or create stunning artworks this program is free, but needs to run on the Linux system. There seem to be few software applications that now don't come as Open Source, this means all the software on your computer for normal day to day needs is available completely free.

By supporting or using even some Open Source applications you are helping to break down the digital divide and helping people in so-called "developing" countries to have access to the incredible power of modern computers and communication.

As with all things, the quality varies from one product to the next, however, Open Source does not in any way imply inferiority to the commercial counterpart, in fact quite the opposite often applies. Astrology programs are a good example: the best calculating program I have ever seen is called Astrolog, absolutely free, customisable and available for the various operating systems.

Open Source is not a movement, it's a revolution! A revolution in freely sharing information and knowledge across all boundaries. Viva la revolution!

Exercise and Women's Health

(Excerpt from the State Government of Victoria's Better Health Channel)

Generally speaking, when compared to Australian men, Australian women are less inclined to exercise and less likely to engage in enough exercise to achieve health benefits.

Lack of exercise is a significant risk factor for a range of medical conditions including cardiovascular disease, diabetes and high blood pressure. Sedentary women are also at an increased risk of developing osteoporosis in later life.

Studies show that older people can achieve significant health benefits after just two to three months of regular exercise. As an added bonus, if you start being regularly active, your body

will continue to benefit from exercise well into your 80s.

If you have a medical condition, are overweight, over 40 years of age or haven't exercised regularly for a long time, see your doctor for medical advice before increasing your physical activity levels.
