After reopening in June, under the management of the Nimbin CTC, staff and volunteers have worked hard to prepare the centre. They are deservedly proud of their efforts, and are looking forward to providing visitor information and advice 7 days a week from the Cullen Street location.

The VIC is stocking a range of local produce including Nimbin Candles, local flora & fauna books, CDs, maps and other local items, with the intention of increasing this range in the near future.

Brochures are available with information on local accommodation, National Parks, attractions, tours, bus timetables, just to name a few.

Local events, courses and other relevant tourist & social info will be posted and regularly updated at the VIC.

Plans are underway for the "Information" or "I" signage to be placed at the Nimbin VC to ensure visibility and increased usage by locals and visitors. We hope to have the signage in place soon.

LCC Assistance

Lismore City Council (LCC) have been very supportive of the Nimbin CTC and their intentions to re-open the VIC at Nimbin.

AGM report

The Nimbin Community Technology Centre has set for itself a management operation that adheres to the highest ethical standards. The CTC has elected a new Management Committee at its Special General Meeting in July, which turned into an Annual General Meeting by consensus.

As sometimes happens within fledgling

organisations, there was a level of confusion on procedure as to how the meeting should run, with the AGM rule book being referred to several times. This shouldn't be taken as a disparaging comment, as Nimbin tends to muddle its way through these problems in good humour.

Seventeen people attended the AGM, with nine being elected, or not challenged in their nomination, onto the Management Committee. The new president of the CTC is David Hallett, who is also the Nimbin Economic Development Officer.

According to David Julian, manager of the CTC, "The main challenge for the CTC, now that its federally sourced funding is coming to an end, is to increase the viability of its newly developed enterprise, the Nimbin Visitor Information Centre, to the point where it not only maintains itself, but supports the original educational facility across the
