
In the swim

Nim-FM is supporting a fundraiser to purchase an oxygen concentrator, valued at \$2,200, for Nimbin Hospital.


Nimbin Hospital Auxilliary will also assist in the purchase of this vital equipment, which at present has to be hired for local patient Don Sharpe and others to use.

All ages A rare quiet moment for the sign-on desk at the Headers Field. Logo comp closes 14th March.


