

Georgie's encaustic art

Billen Cliffs artist Georgina Gough's work encompasses a broad range of mediums, but one of her favourites is 'encaustic art'.

Encaustic art is done using a special iron (without holes) on a low temperature setting to melt beeswax crayons onto the iron, then swiping the hot iron over a surface- which can range from canvas to shiny card and other various other materials.

"There are many different techniques, and each person has their own unique style. It is an excellent way to teach about the use of colours. It is brilliant fun and the beauty is that anyone can do it without any previous artistic ability", Georgie said.

"However, I do not recommend this for anyon

under the age of 8 years old, as there is the high possibility of burning oneself on the iron or with hot wax", she






This exhibition will show responses to this environment, as well as the 'roads' some of us have taken to get here.

Music can give us great joy as well as developing mportant bonuses to our cognitive, organisational and interpersonal skills.




In his introduction, Gerard spoke of some of the benefits of taking music lessons, taking exams and performing for others.
