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Back on the water

ell, it's good to be back. Over the holidy period, the Nimbin Heads Fishing Team didn't do much on the water, and when we did organise a fishing outing, the seas were too big or the the winds were howling, and when we finally did get to sea and caught some fish, bad photography spoiled the story.

So now it's predator season, meaning chasing tuna, wahoo, spotted mackerel and Spanish mackerel, and after another cancellation due to strong winds, yahoo! - three days later a day off work and fishing for predator fish.

Friday morning at 6am, it's so dark you need a torch to find the boat, then cruising up the river with just enough light to cross the bar, the morning looked great, with Gerard, Cal, Pix, Mick, Kev, Rob and Josh on board. Now we needed live bait, which was easy to find in the form of slimy mackerel, yakkas and pike, a good variety of bait.

We went and anchored on an inside reef, set up five balloons with livies two metres under the surface and then we wait. The colour of the water didn't look good for predator fish, being a dirty green, but it didn't take long for Gerard's and Pix's bait to get smashed, and we both landed mac tuna around 6½kg. Over the next hour, the guys landed a couple of bonito and a couple of smaller mac tuna, but this just wasn't Spanish mackerel, so we decided to go to an outside reef for some wahoo.

The water there looked good, a nice colour of blue, good for predator fish, so we trolled three hardbody lures for about an hour. Looked good but done no good – that's fishing. The current was gushing, so it was no good going any wider, and the decision was made to




go back in close, but try a different reef.

We set up the pink balloons again and then comes the wait. Cal was first, he hooked up to a 4kg spotty mackerel, then Josh hooked up to a big fish and played it for ages. 20 minutes later he landed a 15kg longtail tuna. About an hour later, Rob hooked up to a freight train that peeled off about 200 metres of line on its first run, then the fight was on. Last fish of the day and it didn't want to come anywhere near the boat.

After about 20 minutes of fighting this fish, it was closer but not that close, and it decided to go round the boat twice and tangle any line still in the water, then up and around the anchor rope. Rob was in a sweat but wouldn't hand the rod over, no matter how many times you asked him, he was on the fish for about 1/2 an hour before it was close enough to gaff, and he landed a longtail tuna, the twin of Josh's fish, both being 15.14kg each.

After nine hours at sea, it was time to come back home, but what a great day on the water. With the bonito and mac tuna to fillet up ready for our upcoming Fraser Island trip, which just happens to be 47 sleeps away. 12 guys, four boats, can't wait. On that note, tight lines and good fishing, guys.


