A big turn-out, estimated at over 15,000 people, braved extensive police operations on all roads into the village to attend the 22nd Nimbin MardiGrass protestival, held as usual on the first weekend of May.

The planned program went off without a hitch in the strong sunlight, though chilly nights saw many campfires glowing in the packed-out Showgrounds, and a brisk trade for anyone selling jumpers and hats.

Every event was well attended: the forums on almost every aspect of the useful cannabis plant; workshops on cultivation and production techniques; discussion of the raft of decriminalisation precedents overseas; the hilarious Hemp Olympix plus more comedy, poetry and yarns; lots of music for every taste on four stages; a wedding; and fringe events, such as a highly skilled skateboarding competition.

The massive Kombi Konvoy arrived on Saturday on schedule for a 4.20 smoke-in, which saw the packed main street bouncing the inflatable Big Joint along its length.
