The most important outer planetary transit of this year is the closing square between

The last exact square will be on December 24th. Saturn and Uranus will stay in orbit until the end of 2022. The current Saturn – Uranus cycle began in 1988 (until 2032). Saturn and Uranus represent very opposing principles; when they contact each other by conjunction or hard aspect a great amount of tension is created.

Saturn concerns itself with tradition, authority, duty, discipline and responsibility while Uranus is the archetypal impulse representing freedom, individualism, rebelliousness and nonconformity.

Whole school cultural awareness day

"This land's history is the Indigenous history, not a penal colony, not a federation of states, not corporate governance. The cultures of Indigenous people have cared for this country for 99% of its human habitation. This really sunk in."

This was one of the insights noted from participants in the Cultural Awareness Day at Nimbin Cultural Centre on 23rd April.

From his perspective as a Heritage Conservation Officer, Ashley Moran presented a day of inspiring information to the staff and committees of Tuntable Falls Community School and Tuntable Falls Early Learning Centre.

We were introduced to the processes of recording significant sites across New South Wales, all of which gave insight into the sophistication and complexity of the culture on this land for the past 60,000 years.

These included photos, descriptions and explanations of marked trees for burial and ceremonial sites, carved and scarred trees from shield, canoe and implement making, fish traps, initiation sites, ceremonial rings, burial sites, massacre sites, rock art paintings and engravings, tool sharpening sites, seed mill sites, stone arrangements, birthing sites, midden sites and also sites that are linked to stories.

One of the valuable activities we did was experimenting with some of the symbols which Aboriginal culture uses, in conjunction with the songlines, to pass on the knowledge required to live with the land, to teach the seasonal calendar with six seasons that specify where to find food, medicine and water resources and how to prepare these foods and medicines, where to find the best wood and stone for tool making, which animals to hunt and when, what plants are available and what they can be used for, and so much more.

"What I previously saw as squiggles on canvas, I now understand to be part of an indigenous education system for passing on many aspects of living in this country."

The Thomas Dick photo collection is an amazing resource to view, and was so much more valuable to have explained by Ashley. He also discussed many of the cultural practices of marriage, initiation, punishment, burial, and fire stick



farming practices of timed, controlled, low intensity burns. This particular area, The Big Scrub, was like a shopping centre for Indigenous foods and resources.

We finished the day with a tour of the local area, with descriptions of the Dreaming stories that fit the local landscape. It is exciting to hear of the planned new walking track through Mount Jerusalem and Dunoon with safari camping along the way.

The awareness that we have gained from this day as a whole school will enhance this year's ongoing student project focused on the book Young Dark Emu by Bruce Pascoe. Students are reproducing some of the houses, technology and agriculture that are detailed in this book, as evidenced from the documentation of European explorers.

We are aiming to present this project to the community later in the year. Other classes are focusing on Indigenous sustainable land practices in comparison with others around the world.

"I am in awe at how little we still know about Indigenous culture. What Ashley taught us was mostly specific to the Bungalung people, and that small peek into their way of life was a reminder of the incredible richness of culture that we would find all over Australia if we knew how to ask the right questions and look for the right clues."

Memorable Queensland school camp



At the end of April, the intrepid Year 7 and Year 8 students of Nimbin Central School ventured to the foothills of Mt Barney, Queensland, to take part in a three-day camp with the team at Camp Kokoda.

The range of activities challenged the students, especially those with a fear of heights. There was zip-lining, high ropes, the milk-crate stack, giant swing and canoeing, all aimed at pushing the boundaries of our comfort zone.

The students had to take responsibility for carrying all their gear, setting up camp, cooking all meals and leaving the campsite ship-shape.

Some of the bushwalking was arduous and the camp fare


