



Why I did get the jab

Trespectfully thank Michael Balderstone for his article in the December 2021 Nimbin GoodTimes: 'Why I didn't get the jab'. However, I feel that the other voice of the equation needs to be heard.

I have chosen not to be named in this article as I feel some trepidation that my choice and the choices of many other Australians (91.6%) about getting vaccinated puts me at risk of vitriolic condemnation, even in our small community which espouses peace and love.

I don't understand the conspiracy theories relating to both Covid-19 and to vaccines in general.

I look at our world and I see such terrible things that are actually happening; just think of the women and girls in Afghanistan; think of the people in Syria who have had their world bombed to nothing; think of Julian Assange who is still incarcerated for telling us the truth about what has been done in our names.

I think of just these few things and I have no room to make up more terrible things such as that Covid is an international plot by people in power / 'big pharma' / Bill Gates etc etc, to control us.

I don't understand that many of the people, particularly in our small community, will believe in the science of climate change and the devastation that is being done to our environment (as I do, as well) but who won't believe the science underpinning the pathology of the corona virus and its impacts on the world. This is science; we can't pick and choose what science we believe in.

And yes, I am not so naive to believe our understanding of the world doesn't change, often quite radically, as we explore and investigate natural phenomenon, but we have strong science behind corona viruses that has been built on, over years and years of research.

Corona viruses are real and this particular manifestation has killed over five million people to date. I think of all the grief that number of deaths entails: mothers, fathers, families and friends grieving for people who have died.

Also I spare a thought for the people who care for them, the health professionals who every day deal with the sick and dying.

I absolutely respect that people should have the right to choose whether they are vaccinated or not, however, all life decisions we make have consequences.

Every day we choose to get in a car (or most of us do) and put on our seatbelt. I remember when seatbelts first became mandatory there was talk of infringements on individual rights – we don't hear that comment now as people recognise that wearing a seat belt reduces the risk of death or catastrophic injury.

This is not only about individual rights, the cost to society of a person's death or injury is immense and we all should be mindful about our responsibilities to each other.

I see getting vaccinated very much part of my responsibility to our society. I don't want more vulnerable people (older people, very young children, sick people or people with a disability) to be put at risk so that my right not to be vaccinated is upheld.

I truly see that my individual rights are not any more important than the responsibility I have to the collective (society). I believe we have become so pampered in Australia that we have forgotten what it is to look out for each other, we as a nation are very selfcentred.

We only have to look at recent elections and see how people always vote to maintain the cash in their hip pockets rather than looking to the greater good for the country.

I recognise that people are concerned about the safety of the Covid vaccines. However, I look and see that in Australia we had the luxury of the biggest Phase 3 trials across America and Europe while those populations were vaccinated before us.

We pretty much knew what the impact of the vaccine was going to be. The clotting issue with the Astra vaccines was extremely rare and now it is known and is monitored for and treatable, it is less of a problem.

All medications have side effects (everything, even naturopathic medication). It is not realistic or considered to expect there would be no adverse effects of the vaccine.

All medical decisions require a weighing up of risks versus benefits and then making an informed choice.

I chose to be vaccinated and am willing to accept the consequences of that choice, if there are adverse sequels to my choice I am still willing to be vaccinated as I believe strongly that the risk of Covid to our society is immense and my responsibility as an individual is to help protect not only myself but also the vulnerable in our society.

Those of us who chose to be vaccinated are not uninformed and I do not expect to change people's minds, but we do need to listen and respect each other's decisions and live with the consequences of our own decision.

Please respect each other and live with the consequences of your decision not to be vaccinated, as I live with the consequences of my choice to be vaccinated.

vastly improved scientific knowledge and communications.


Those who believe the vaccines are designed to kill us or implant substances that will allow elites to control us, simply deny the accumulated knowledge of the past 100 years.


Being immunocompromised, I expect if I get Covid I will probably die. Norm also.
