

Julian Assange's stroke

Concerns have surfaced about a UK cover-up of Julian Assange's medical condition and the ministroke he suffered in October last year.

On 27th October, the first day of the US appeal in the UK High Court against a lower court decision not to extradite hium, Assange suffered a mini-stroke.

Three Australian journalists. Joe Lauria and Cathy Vogen from Consortium News, along with legendary former SBS news anchor, Mary Kostakidis, watched the hearing via videolink from Australia.

In a recent post, the trio raised questions about whether the UK High Court covered up Julian's medical condition during the trial. Cathy Vogan from *Consortium News* said:

"We saw Julian in the lead-up if not the actual event of his minor stroke. It happened during the first day of the High Court hearing.

"The defence lawyer announced that Julian had received heavy medication and wouldn't make it, but Julian turned up an hour later.

"This is a mysterious circumstance because we didn't hear about Julian's stroke until mid-December." Former SBS news presenter, Mary Kostakidis, has the same concerns. She said, "It is likely that Julian had the stroke just prior to the hearing and his inability to animate the right side of his face and his inability to hold his head up without the support of his right palm would have been the effect of the mini-stroke. "His lawyers were told he would not attend the



video link due to an increase in medication that was unexplained and which judge Fitzgerald announced at the beginning of the hearing.

"I subsequently asked Stella (Assange's wife) about this, and she told me that Julian had wanted to attend but the prison had not allowed it.

"It occurs to me that the very reason an attempt was made to ensure that he did not appear, and the court were not able to see him or ignored him, was precisely so his newly deteriorated condition and its possible cause would not become an issue. That was certainly the result."

The High Court judges ruled in favour of the US, accepting the US argument that the trial judge Baraitser erred because she should have sought diplomatic assurances from the United States that Assange would be kept in conditions that would not trigger suicide. After the US glibly gave some meaningless assurances, the UK High Court signed off on the extradition of Julian Assange to receive a 'fair trial' in a court in Virginia that always convicts. Now that the UK Home Secretary has decided to extradite Assange, pressure is building on the Albanese government to make strong representations on his behalf.



When the children at preschool recently saw images of homes and permanent settlements by our First Nations' people, their fascination and curiosity was palpable. They discussed the designs, the materials, the comfort rating...

And when all that was done, Albie, nearly 5, excitedly showed me the huge and detailed home that he and Finn had designed and built all morning out of blocks and all sorts of other bits and pieces.

"Leanne!" Albie suddenly exclaimed, "you could tell your story here today! You could sit here, and the audience can sit there!"

A director in the making? A future engineer? Who knows? What I did know was that I'd been invited into an ephemeral storytelling home – one that hadn't existed before that day and wouldn't exist in a few days time – by a boy with a generous heart, a willingness to share, and an excitement for exploring everything about 'home'.
