HempScape will not only showcase a wide range of products but also act as a resource for builders, architects and homeowners interested in adopting hempcrete for sustainable living.

The shop promises to provide everything from hemp-based

materials to expert advice, bridging the gap between traditional construction and eco-friendly innovation.

HempScape will host workshops, demonstrations and community events to spread knowledge of hemp's incredible versatility and its role in building a greener future.
